



## NEWSLETTER September 2017



The topics reflect a continuing, vigorous and wide-ranging scope of archaeological research in which new and important discoveries are being all the time, on almost every period of the past from early prehistoric to the early modern era.

The speakers reflect the varied membership of the Forum with representatives of local archaeological contractors, the University, the York Museums Trust and a local community group, as well as the City of York Council's Archaeologist.
